The initiative begins with the collaborative efforts of three distinct entities: VF Art Projects (Luxembourg), ABRE Art Gallery (Argentina), and DIGALLERY (Spain). Together, we share a common goal of promoting Ibero-American Art and fostering an environment for the exchange of ideas and experiences within the framework of UNSEEN.

The artists chosen for this project, Dionisio Gonzalez (1965, Spain) and Hugo Aveta (1965, Argentina), hail from the same generation and explore themes related to architecture and the manner in which spaces are inhabited. Their work delves into how spaces encapsulate time, memory, and meaning, and how individuals interact with their social and natural environments. Both artists find common ground in their conceptual reflections and technical methodologies, exhibiting a shared fascination with the construction of spatial fiction, the interplay between reality and imagination, and the concept of simulation. Through their artistic processes, they create models that are then captured in photographs.

Hugo Aveta's work often involves reconstructing spaces that are historically significant yet no longer exist, evoking the memories and horrors of their pasts. His pieces, such as those in "The Chamber of Wonders," depict ruins and remnants of theaters, presenting them as microcosms through which larger realities are interpreted—a mechanism akin to the classical 'theatrum mundi' that facilitates observation and understanding of reality.

Dionisio Gonzalez operates in often conflict-ridden territories, approaching his craft with a purposeful intent rather than a substitutive one, as he describes. His thoughts and research are heavily influenced by philosophers like Ludwig Wittgenstein. Working in isolation, Gonzalez focuses on study and observation. In his series "Wittgenstein's Aviary," he reflects on themes of flight and voluntary exile, considering escape not just as a departure from social, domestic, or relational norms, but also as a movement driven by desire or necessity. The environments he creates serve as small habitats that foster states of silence, contemplation, and reflection

The works featured at UNSEEN facilitate a dialogue between these two artists, emphasizing both the commonalities in their practices and the unique conceptual and aesthetic qualities of their art. This not only showcases their individual talents but also sparks a broader conversation about the nature of art and space.

GIJÓN, SPAIN. 1965.

A visually renowned international artist whose work proactively explores the habitational issues faced by both vernacular and irregular architecture and the grand, failed utopian constructions of the post-World War II era. In particular, it focuses on architectures prone to collapse and fading.

The artist has received multiple awards such as: Pilar Juncosa and Sotheby's Award, Fundació Pilar i Joan Miró; Arendt Award for European Photographer; Observatorio D'Achtall Photography Award; National Engraving Award; Off PhotoEspaña Festival Award; patronage from the María Cristina Masaveu Peterson Foundation; Leonardo Scholarship, BBVA, and others.

The artist's work has been exhibited in some of the most prestigious institutions and museums worldwide, including: the Museum of Contemporary Art, Cleveland; Museum of Contemporary Art of Bordeaux; Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofía (MNCARS), Madrid; Museum of Contemporary Photography, Chicago; Museum of Modern Art of Bogotá (MAMBO); Folkwang Museum, Essen; Museum of Art São Paulo

(MASP); Museum of Contemporary Art (MOCCA), Toronto; KIASMA Museum of Contemporary Art, Helsinki; Kunstverein Heidelberg; Museum of Art, Architecture, and Technology (MAAT), Lisbon; (MARTA) Hedford Museum, Germany; George Pompidou Center, Metz, and others.





HUGO AVETA

CÓRDOBA, ARGENTINA 1965.

Internationally acclaimed Argentine artist, initially trained in film and architecture, later transitioned to a dedicated pursuit of photography. This multimedia artist's work meticulously documents the memories and remnants of the turbulent periods experienced by his country. Through the mediums of photography and film, he explores the more universal themes of memory and its transmission.

Aveta is captivated by the physicality of materials and the exploration of fault lines. His art portrays a struggle of forces, laden with uncertainties, risks, and failures, yet it also embodies dreams and hopes—fragile and shaken but enduring.

His recent exhibitions include "Invisible Gods" at the Museo de los Inmigrantes in Buenos Aires, Argentina; "The Fascination of the Fault" at Kuzzam Palace in Saudi Arabia, and at MACVAL Museum of Contemporary Art in Paris, France.

His works have been featured in renowned institutions and museums worldwide, such as the J.P. Getty Museum in Los Angeles, Quai Branly Museum in Paris, Jeu de Paume in Paris, Museu Nacional d'Art de Catalunya in Barcelona; MUNTREF in Buenos Aires; University Museum of Contemporary Art in Mexico, National Museum of Fine Arts in Buenos Aires, Museum of Contemporary Art in Cleveland, Museum of Contemporary Art Reina Sofía in Madrid (MNCARS), Museum of Contemporary Photography in Chicago, Museum of Modern Art of Bogotá (MAMBO), Folkwang Museum in Essen, São Paulo Museum of Art (MASP), Museum of Contemporary Art (MOCCA) in Toronto, KIASMA Museum of Contemporary Art in Helsinki, Heilderberg Kunstverein, and MAAT Museum of Art Architecture and Technology in Lisbon, among others.

He has participated in significant international platforms such as the Biennial of the End of the World in Argentina, Mercosur Biennial in Brazil, PhotoQuai Biennial in France, Curitiba Biennial in Brazil, BIENALSUR; and prestigious art fairs including Paris Photo, Loop Barcelona, and Unseen in Amsterdam
